

What do Electricians do?

Electricians employed in manufacturing specialize in electrical wiring of buildings, stationary machines, and related equipment. Electricians generally focus on either construction or maintenance, although many do both. Electricians design lighting systems, install street lights and intercom systems, ensure electrical work is up to code, and repair electrical wiring. Most will specialize in either designing, installing, maintaining and repairing the motors, equipment and electrical systems of businesses and factories, or installing, maintaining and repairing the electrical systems of residences. Electricians read blueprints and technical drawings that show the locations of circuits, outlets, load centers, panel boards, and other equipment and install and connect the wires to circuit breakers, transformers, outlets, or other components and systems. They work indoors and outdoors and often carry heavy equipment.

Training & Educational Opportunities

You will have many opportunities as an electrician once you've completed a certification program or associate degree. An apprenticeship will be required as well as licensing. At the end of the four to five years of training, apprentices can choose to earn the journey worker designation.

As a Electrician you will:

- Advise management on whether continued operation of equipment could be hazardous
- Assemble, install, test, or maintain electrical or electronic wiring, equipment, appliances, apparatus, or fixtures, using hand tools or power tools
- Connect wires to circuit breakers, transformers, or other components

- Construct or fabricate parts, using hand tools, according to specifications
